

The **Beaux Arts Ball** (in French the **Bal des Quatres Arts**) is the annual costume ball traditionally given by the students of the *École nationale supérieure des Beaux-Arts* in Paris. Elaborate floats circled the room at midnight and were judged by a panel. In 1931, in New York, famous architects dressed up as their buildings and today, many American architecture schools hold similar costume balls.










SKYSCRAPER COUTURE
